## To Our Community

The year 2008 created unprecedented challenges for nearly every sector of the economy—and health care was no exception. St. Luke's entire team approached these challenges with courage, grace and ingenuity, suggesting ways to help reduce costs and increase revenue, without sacrificing the quality of patient care.

With the help of a three-year grant from the Minnesota Job Skills Partnership, St. Luke's partnered with Lake Superior College to train our employees in a process improvement practice called Lean. Through this process, we are learning to evaluate our services from a patient/customer perspective so we can make improvements that will benefit them. Our goal is to have all St. Luke's staff involved in Lean principles in the next few years.

Learning how to decrease our expenses—without compromising the quality of patient care—required us to make some tough decisions. One of these decisions was to change how we provide emergency helicopter services by joining Life Link III, a non-profit consortium of eight health care organizations in Minnesota and Wisconsin. Several members of the original flight crew of Luke's One, our emergency helicopter service for the past 13 years, joined the Life Link III base in Hibbing, Minnesota. Having helicopter bases in multiple locations throughout the region has enabled us to better serve our patients and communities.

Other noteworthy changes include the addition of several new services, including Q Care, St. Luke's express medical clinic; St. Luke's Orthopedics; St. Luke's Infusion Therapy Clinic satellite pharmacy; and a new minimally-invasive, outpatient hysterectomy procedure.

We are pleased to report that we ended the year with a positive bottom line. But most important, throughout the ups and downs of 2008, St. Luke's employees never lost sight of our mission to put the patient above all else.

# Bringing Our Mission to Life

## A Story of Humanity, Science and Survival

After years of medical school, internships and residencies, followed by more than 13 years as an emergency department physician, Dr. Chris Delp thought he'd seen it all. But on December 27, 2008, the St. Luke's Emergency Services doctor and his team faced a medical emergency without precedent, prior experience or much hope for a full recovery—let alone survival.

That cold December evening, 64-year-old Duluth resident Janice Goodger, who has severe rheumatoid arthritis, had slipped on an icy driveway. Unable to get up, she lay in the frigid snow until her family discovered her four hours later. By the time emergency responders arrived, Goodger had fallen into unconsciousness and hypothermia, and her heart had stopped.

Gold Cross paramedics and Duluth Fire Department crews knew that the heart muscle had to be warmed before it could start beating again—with her body temperature now registering 70 degrees, it was too risky to try shocking the heart into action. For the next hour, they administered CPR to keep the blood circulating in order to prevent damage to the brain and other organs.

Back at St. Luke's, with Goodger's body temperature now at 60 degrees, Delp and his team set up heated IV drips and a machine to pump heated air into her body. Cardiothoracic surgeon Mary Boylan, MD, and her team then drained Goodger's blood, warmed it and then returned it to her. Just two hours later, surgeons gave a shock to the heart muscle and restored it to normalcy. Still, Drs. Delp and Boylan knew there were no guarantees that their patient would survive the night—or if she did, how severe her neurological damage would be.

The next morning, when Drs. Delp and Boylan returned to the hospital, they were completely unprepared for what they saw. Instead of finding their patient on life support, they were greeted by an upbeat, energetic woman who just wanted to see her grandchildren. When asked about her miraculous story of survival, Goodger credits three key factors: her Norwegian heritage, a habit of wearing long underwear, and most important, the quality of care provided by the emergency responders and St. Luke's outstanding medical team. In addition to Drs. Boylan and Delp, the team included Norman Boucher, MD, anesthesiologist; Gina Andrew, certified clinical profusionist; and other dedicated professionals.

#### Two-Year Laboratory Accreditation Awarded by CAP

St. Luke's was awarded two-year accreditation by the Commission on Laboratory Accreditation of the College of American Pathologists (CAP).



### Improving Pharmacy Services for Infusion Patients

St. Luke's opened the Infusion Therapy Clinic (ITC) pharmacy to offer more efficient pharmacy services for infusion patients. Conveniently located in St. Luke's Regional Cancer Center, the ITC pharmacy reduces wait time, increases accuracy and streamlines communication between the pharmacy and ITC nursing staff. The ITC pharmacy was made possible with generous support from St. Luke's Foundation.



## Q Care Offers Convenient, Accessible Health Care

St. Luke's opened Q Care express medical clinic, located in the Duluth Cub Foods, to offer convenient, affordable, walk-in care for minor health concerns to people of all ages. Staffed by a physician assistant or nurse practitioner, Q Care provides diagnosis and treatment for a wide range of common medical concerns.



## Sleep Disorders Center Receives Accreditation

St. Luke's Sleep Disorders Center received a five-year accreditation from the American Academy of Sleep Medicine by meeting or exceeding the organization's standards of care. Under the leadership of St. Luke's Pulmonary Medicine Associates physicians Vance Bachelder, MD, and Joseph Martinelli, MD, the Center conducts sleep studies for individuals who may be experiencing sleep apnea, insomnia, leg movement disorders or narcolepsy.



## Rehab Program Re-accredited by CARF

St. Luke's Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation Program received a three-year accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), the highest rating awarded by the agency. This accreditation reflects the program's outstanding staff, quality of services and commitment to improving the lives of the people it serves.



## Home Care and Emergency Department Receive PRC Awards

Professional Research Consultants (PRC) honored St. Luke's Home Care with a Five Star Excellence Award for Overall Quality of Care (top 10 percent nationally), and St. Luke's Emergency Department with a Four Star Excellence Award for Overall Quality of Care (top 25 percent nationally). In addition, St. Luke's Home Care was named among the top 25 percent of the 2008 HomeCare Elite, which represents the most successful Medicare-certified home health care providers in the nation.





#### St. Luke's Earns Governor's Safety Award

The Minnesota Safety Council presented St. Luke's with a Governor's Safety Award for excellence in workplace safety and health. St. Luke's earned the Meritorious Achievement Award for improved safety initiatives and safety awareness of management and staff, and a reduced injury/incident rate as compared to other organizations with the same industry classification.



### Physicians Recognized for Excellence in Diabetes Care

The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA), in conjunction with the American Diabetes Association, reviewed 25 charts representing St. Luke's Internal Medicine and Family Medicine physicians. Physicians who met the criteria for 10 evidence-based health care measures are recognized on the NCQA website, www.ncqa.org.



## St. Luke's Earns Two Patient Safety Excellence Awards

St. Luke's earned two Minnesota Hospital Association (MHA) Patient Safety Excellence Awards for implementing MHA's best practices for the "SAFE from FALLS" and "SAFE SKIN" initiatives. St. Luke's was recognized for its work in preventing patients from falling and from developing pressure ulcers during hospital stays.



#### Cardiac and Stroke Care Recognized for Quality Performance

The American Heart Association (AHA) and the American Stroke Association, a division of AHA, recognized St. Luke's performance in treating cardiac and stroke patients using the AHA's Get with the Guidelines<sup>™</sup> program. St. Luke's was among the hospitals featured in *U.S. News & World Report's* issue on "America's Best Hospitals" (July 21, 2008).



## Full Accreditation Awarded by the Joint Commission

St. Luke's hospital, clinics and Home Care earned full accreditation from the Joint Commission by complying with national standards on health care quality and safety. An independent, non-profit organization, the Joint Commission accredits and certifies more than 16,000 health care organizations and programs nationwide that have achieved certain performance standards.



## Minimally Invasive Hysterectomy Procedure Now Available

St. Luke's and Northland OB/GYN Associates now offer Laparoscopic Supracervical Hysterectomy (LSH) on an outpatient basis, enabling women to return home within 24 hours and resume normal activity in less than two weeks.



## Life Link III Supports Trauma Care Services

St. Luke's joined the Life Link III consortium, a comprehensive transportation system with helicopter bases in St. Cloud, Hutchinson, Eden Prairie and Hibbing (Minnesota) and New Richmond and Rice Lake (Wisconsin).





### Medal of Honor Awarded by U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

St. Luke's is one of eight Minnesota-based hospitals and one of 412 nationwide to receive the Medal of Honor from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for outstanding work in organ donation.



### **Preparing Children for Success in School**

Reach Out and Read® is a national reading program designed to build early literacy skills that will prepare children for success in school. At St. Luke's Pediatric Associates, Heather Winesett, MD, the Duluth Chapter's medical director, along with colleagues Gretchen Karstens, MD, Lylan Park, MD, and Noelle Westrum, MD, give books to children during their well-child visits and help parents understand the importance of reading aloud to their kids.



## St. Luke's Clinics Earn COLA Accreditation

Duluth Internal Medicine Associates, Mariner Medical Clinic, Miller Creek Medical Clinic and Mount Royal Medical Clinic were awarded laboratory accreditation by COLA for maintaining standards of quality and accuracy in proficiency testing. COLA is a physician-directed organization that promotes excellence in laboratory medicine and patient care through voluntary education, consultation and accreditation.
