September 2019 Announcement of Research Grant Opportunity

St. Luke's and the University of Minnesota Medical School, Duluth continue to work together through the Whiteside Institute for Clinical Research to promote clinical research in the region and to encourage research collaboration. In the last twenty years, seventy-seven Whiteside grants have been awarded totaling over \$1,019,000.

The Whiteside Institute for Clinical Research seeks grant applications for collaborative clinical and translational research related to preventing or treating cancer, lung disease or heart disease. Clinical research includes, but is not limited to, studies of therapeutic interventions including clinical trials of drugs, disease prevention and health promotion; evaluation of diagnostic tests or strategies; behavioral studies; health services research; epidemiologic studies; outcomes research and translational research. \$65,000 are available for qualified proposals to support costs deemed essential to the research project. Applications submitted in response to this announcement may be submitted for any amount but may not exceed \$30,000. Grant awards generally range from \$15,000 to \$20,000. Indirect costs are not authorized under this announcement.

The deadline for applications is Friday, November 1, 2019, with grant awards being announced in mid-December 2019.
